RMC to hold Behavioral Health Services Ceremony with MUSC Health

ORANGEBURG, SC – The Regional Medical Center (RMC) will celebrate the grand opening of the outpatient *Pathways* to Behavioral Health Clinic and newly renovated inpatient Behavioral Health Center as part of the affiliation with MUSC Health on Tuesday, November 17 at 5:30 p.m. in the RMC Education Center.

Members of the public are encouraged to attend the event and learn more about the behavioral health services offered at RMC and the MUSC Health affiliation. Tours of the new outpatient *Pathways* clinic will be offered.

Andrew W. Hedgepath, M.D. will serve as the Medical Director of the 15-bed inpatient Behavioral Health Center. A faculty member with the Medical University of South Carolina, Dr. Hedgepath will provide behavioral health professional services exclusively to the RMC community.

Valerie L. Holmstrom, Ph.D, ABPP will serve as the Practice Manager of the outpatient *Pathways* to Behavioral Health Clinic. In addition to Dr. Holmstrom, two licensed professional counselors will provide outpatient services to the RMC community.

The outpatient *Pathways* to Behavioral Health Clinic services will include intellectual assessments, differential diagnosis of psychiatric and behavioral disorders, evaluation of cognitive disorders and memory impairment, individual, marital and family therapy, and educational-based therapy for development of self-management skills. Clinical staff will provide evaluation and treatment of a variety of mental health disorders including adjustment disorders, anxiety disorders, depression and mood disorders, post-traumatic stress disorder, attention deficit disorder, marital and family dysfunction and bereavement.

The Behavioral Health Center is a 15-bed, inpatient care unit serving adults 18 years and older who voluntarily seek behavioral health services that require a short inpatient stay. Treatment is available for a variety of conditions including, but not limited to, depression, psychosis, bipolar disorder, and extreme anxiety. Services offered include psychiatric consultation, individualized treatment planning, individual and group therapy, occupational therapy, nutritional therapy, medication management, after care planning and follow-up.
