> Equals that of 49 full time paid staff (FTE's)


1,310 volunteers contributed hours to MUSC this year

FINANCE

- 6 fundraiser events were hosted
- \$29,320 in funds raised to support volunteer department initiatives



CONTINUING EDUCATION

Physical Therapy

- > 39 physical therapy students gained service hours that allowed them to apply for post graduate studies
- > 20 received inpatient hospital experience
- > 19 received outpatient hospital experience

Pharmacy

- > 15 pharmacy students gained service hours that allowed them to apply for post graduate studies
- > 1 Pharmacy volunteer selected to attend MUSC for graduate studies in Pharmacy



COMMUNITY OUTREACH

Safe Sitter®, Babysitting classes

- > Two Safe Sitter course offered this summer
- > Two full day sessions
- > 26 students certified as Safe Sitters



PATIENT EXPERIENCE

Patient and Family Advisory Councils

- > 6 councils: Adult Hospital, Institute of Psychiatry, Ambulatory Care, Children's Hospital Inpatient, Children's Ambulatory, & Youth Patient Advisory Council
- > 61 active members contributing over 1,270 hours to enhance the patient experience last year

Patient Transport

Volunteers discharged 1,268 patients allowing the clinical care team to have more time providing care on the floor

Palliative Care

> 11 Volunteers contributed 890 hours to our patients and families, providing comfort, massage and legacy projects

In-Kind Donations

> \$99,661 was received to benefit our Children's hospital programs enhancing the patient experience

Crafts: Therapy dolls, comfort kits, pillowcases, lap blankets, bonnets and so much more

> 21,481 hours of community service was given making crafts for our patients and families

Comfort Meals

- > 25,058 meals were served to our families this year
- > 525 community partners and MUSC volunteers participated in hosting the meals

Pet Therapy Program

- Over 16,000 pet therapy visits for our patients, families and staff
- > 3,565 inpatient requests fulfilled for visitation by a patient while in the hospital

CAREER EXPLORATION

Junior Volunteer Program

- > 69 Junior Volunteers Contributed 4,201 hours of service this year
- > High school students ages 14-18 interested in health care careers
- > Candy Striper Program during summer months
 - 30 students, 2 three week sessions
 - 16 placement opportunities to explore health care careers in clinical and non-clinical settings
